ARCHIVAL POLICY ON DISCLOSURES

1. INTRODUCTION

In pursuance of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (“Listing Regulations”), Insecticides (India) Limited (“the Company”) is required to disclose on its website all such events or information which has been disclosed to stock exchanges where the securities of the Company are listed (“Stock Exchanges”) under Regulation 30 of Listing Regulations. Further, such disclosures shall be hosted on the website of the Company for a minimum period of 5 years and thereafter as per the archival policy of the Company, as disclosed on its website. Accordingly, the Company has adopted this “Archival Policy on disclosures to be hosted from time to time on the website of the Company” (“Policy”). The Policy is effective from December 1, 2015.

2. PERIOD OF HOSTING THE EVENTS OR INFORMATION

All the disclosures made by the Company to the Stock Exchanges under Regulation 30 of the Listing Regulations, shall be hosted on the website of the Company namely <https://www.insecticidesindia.com/> for a minimum period of 5 years except audio/video recordings of post earnings or quarterly calls for a minimum period of 2 years. Thereafter, such disclosures shall be kept in the archives of the Company for a period of 3 years.

In case the aforesaid disclosures are required by any applicable law or regulation to be hosted for a period longer than that mentioned above, such disclosures shall be hosted on the website of the Company for such longer period.

3. AMENDMENT

The Policy can be amended, modified or revised by the Managing Director of the Company or any other person as may be authorised by the Board from time to time. In case any provisions of the Policy are contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, rules framed thereunder and Listing Regulations (“Statutory Provisions”), the provisions of Statutory Provisions shall prevail.
